Gulf 7 Pediatric Disaster Network

- **Pediatric Disaster Course**: G7 and TEEX created a free 16-hour course for all seven G7 states/territories, focused on pediatric resiliency & recovery, emergency management, public health, & clinical preparedness.
- **G7 Pediatric Regional Exercises**: Each year, G7 has 1 functional exercise and 6 in-person tabletop exercises at hospitals in each of our states/territories.
 - o 2023 Exercise scenario: Radiologic Disaster-Pediatric Patient Surge
 - o 2024 Exercise scenario: Family Reunification Following a Natural Disaster
- G7 Preparedness Packets: Packets will include high-yield education, templates and examples of a preparedness/response plan, online module for education and/or parent education document.
 o Packet topics are Decontamination, Reunification, HID, Burn, MCI, and Evacuation.
- Pediatric Trauma & Grief in the Aftermath of Natural Disasters: TGCT (Trauma and Grief Component Therapy) Learning Collaboratives for School and Community-Based Clinicians/Counselors.
